1099R for 2018

If you have not received your 1099R for 2018, please contact the pension office so we can mail you a new form. You will need this form for filing your income tax return for 2018. Do not wait until the last minute! Replacement forms will be issued free-of-charge through April 17, 2019. Any request for a replacement after that date will be filled only upon receipt of a \$15.00 processing fee. If you receive a Duty Disability benefit from the ERS, you will not receive a 1099R, because this benefit is not taxable or reportable to the IRS.

If you are a recent retiree and you received a GPS lump-sum bonus during 2018 and elected to roll over all or part of your GPS lump sum bonus, you should have received a separate 1099-R for your GPS lump sum bonus rollover. If you elected to receive all or part of the GPS lump sum bonus in cash, the payment you received in cash was included with the 1099-R containing your monthly annuity payments.

If you receive multiple benefits from the ERS (e.g. your own benefit as well as a survivorship benefit from the account of your deceased spouse), you should have received a separate 1099-R for each benefit you received in 2018.

The ERS staff is not allowed to give tax advice or answer specific tax questions. We cannot recommend how much you should have withheld or tell you if you need to file a tax return. Please consult the applicable IRS instructions or a tax professional.

If you would like to change your tax withholding for federal or WI taxes, you may download the tax withholding form from our website at: www.cmers.com under "Benefits" "Pension Payment Information" "Tax withholding". If you do not have internet access, you may contact the ERS office and we will mail you the required form.

Retired members can view their current (2018) 1099R data as well as past 1099R data on our Member Self Service Site. Instructions for creating a secure login can be found on our website under "ERS Member Self Service."

2018 Investment Update

The City of Milwaukee Pension Fund earned a return of -2.9%, net of fees, in 2018. This return outperformed the Fund's blended benchmark by 0.4%. U.S. GDP growth was positive each quarter in 2018, and the unemployment rate fell to 3.9% by year-end. Although the U.S. economy remained steady in 2018, continued worries about trade wars and the government shutdown caused weakness in equity markets in the fourth quarter. The market worries led to negative returns in traditional asset classes. The Fund's public equity allocation was down -9.9%, and fixed income was down -0.4%, both net of fees. Alternative asset classes fared better, with Absolute Return gaining 1.4%, net of fees, and Private Equity reporting returns of 21.5%, net of fees. Over the prior twelve months ending September 2018, the ERS' real estate portfolio had a return of 9.0%, net of fees, which is the most recent time period for which data is available. The market value of the Fund on December 31, 2018, totaled approximately \$4.95 billion.

<u>Has my check amount changed?</u> <u>COLA Increase:</u>

Were you eligible for a Cost of Living Adjustment (COLA) increase? More than half of our retirees receive COLA increases effective January 1st of each year. (The remaining retirees receive their COLA increase on their

retirement anniversary.)

Tax changes:

Effective January 1, 2019, the federal income tax withholding tables changed to reflect new tax rates. If you currently have federal tax withheld from your benefit and this withholding is being done in accordance with the tax tables, you may have noticed a change in your federal tax withholding on your January 2019 benefit payment. If you currently have a flat dollar amount withheld, the amount withheld will not change.

Closing Bank Accounts

Please be sure to notify our office if you plan to close your current bank account. You must submit a new ACH (direct deposit) form. We suggest you open the new account first, let us know in a timely manner and then close your old account after the first transfer has gone into your new account. If you need a direct deposit form to change accounts, please download the form from our website www.cmers.com on the "Forms" page, under "Other" or call our office to request that a form be sent to you.
