2020 Health Insurance Benefits

*** Please do not call the ERS regarding health insurance if you are a MPS, MMSD, United Water, Veolia or MATC retiree. Contact your agency directly. ***

The Health Benefits Open Enrollment period started on Monday, October 28, 2019 and ends on Friday November 15, 2019. If you do not wish to change your health and prescription drug benefits plan, you do not need to do anything.

Please make note of the following:

- There will be 2020 plan design changes to both health plans offered by the City to its retirees (UHC Choice EPO and UHC Choice Plus PPO), so you should review the 2020 Retiree Benefits guide carefully.
- There will be a rate increase for retirees under the City's health plans (approximately 3% for retirees under the age of 65 years, and approximately 6.7% for retirees 65 and over).
- Any benefit changes you make during the 2019 open enrollment period will take effect on January 1, 2020. You will continue to be covered under your current health plan through December 31, 2019.
- If you did not receive an Enrollment Packet or you are not currently enrolled in a City health insurance plan and wish to receive a packet or enrollment form, call the ERS Open Enrollment Hotline at (414) 286-3689.
- If you are choosing to drop your City of Milwaukee retiree coverage, both Medicare retirees and retirees without Medicare, you must notify the ERS in writing at least 30 days in advance. Please note that you must maintain health insurance coverage if you ever plan to return to the City of Milwaukee's retiree coverage. At that time, you will be required to provide proof of creditable coverage during the period that you were not covered by the City's plan.
- The ERS does not send automatic confirmations upon receipt of open enrollment forms. If you would like to receive confirmation of receipt, please enclose a self-addressed stamped envelope for this purpose when submitting your form. We also recommend that you keep a copy of your open enrollment form for your records prior to mailing it to the ERS.
- **Open Enrollment Fairs**: The City scheduled five Open Enrollment Fairs that are open to all City employees and retirees. Three dates will still be available at the time of this newsletter's publication (please see "important dates" below for more information).

Be Careful of Scam Artists

Protect your personal information, do not fall prey to phone or email scams. Occasionally an ERS payee falls prey to a phone scam. We cannot emphasize strongly enough that you should never provide personal information, such as your social security number, bank account number, date of birth, etc., to anyone who makes an unsolicited phone call to you. Under no circumstances will the ERS, your bank, credit card company or any governmental agency, including representatives for the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) or Affordable Care Act (aka Obamacare) ever call you to verify this information—they will already have it in their records. These scam artists can sound very convincing over the phone.

Scammers also use caller ID spoofing, where the name of the company/ governmental agency will show on your caller ID, even though they are not a representative from that company or governmental agency. If the caller gives you a phone number to call to verify they are from that agency, do not call that number. Hang up and call the customer service number printed on your statement, the company's website or phonebook.

Additionally, never respond to an email requesting that you provide personal information to verify an account or to reactivate that account or service. Delete email and text messages that ask you to confirm or provide personal information (credit card and bank account numbers, social security numbers, passwords, etc.). Legitimate companies do not ask for this information via email or text.

The Census Is Hiring

The Census Bureau must conduct a census every ten years. The information collected is critical to a community's ability to seek federal support for many public programs and political representation. The official Census will begin on April 1, 2020.

If you are interested in being part of the Census team, the first step is to complete the online job application https://recruitment.2020census.gov

You will need your social security number, home address, email, phone number, date of birth, and place of birth. If you run into issues during the application process, you can call 1-855-562-2020 and select option 1 for tech support or 3 to speak with someone at your area census office.
